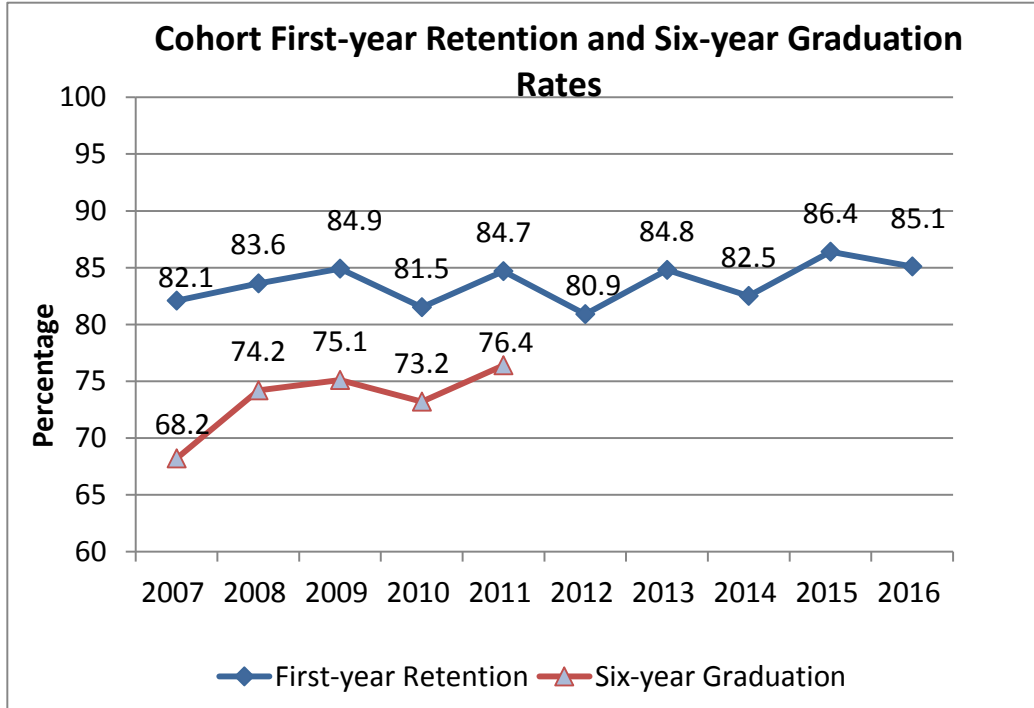

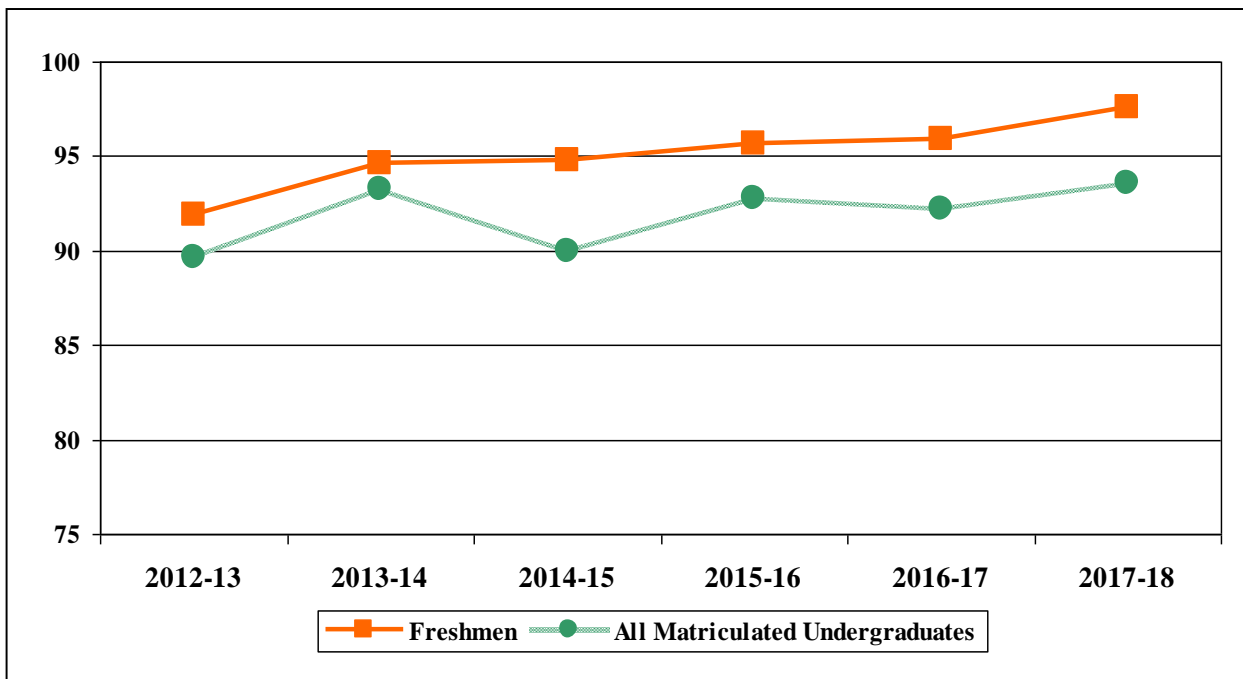

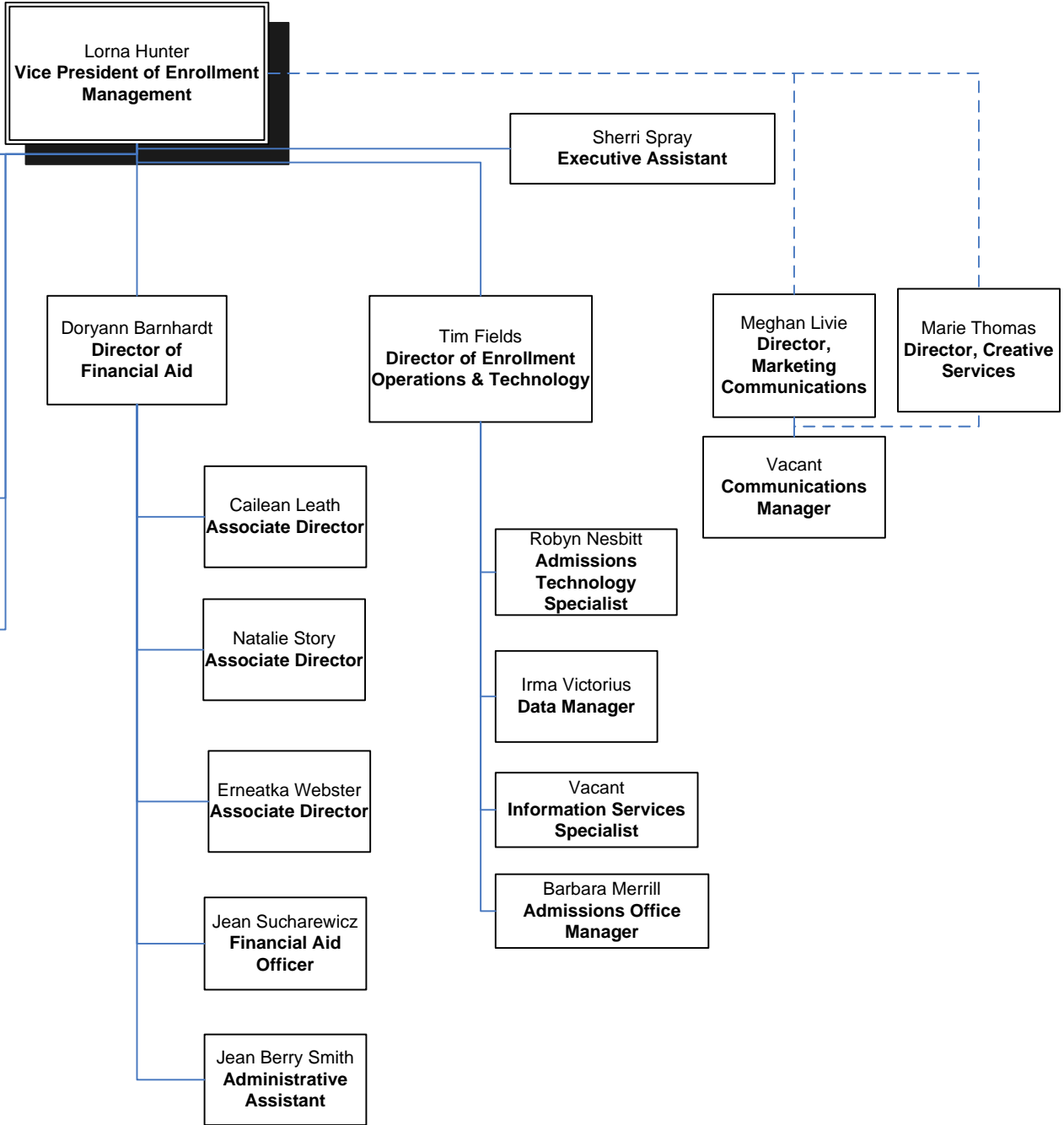

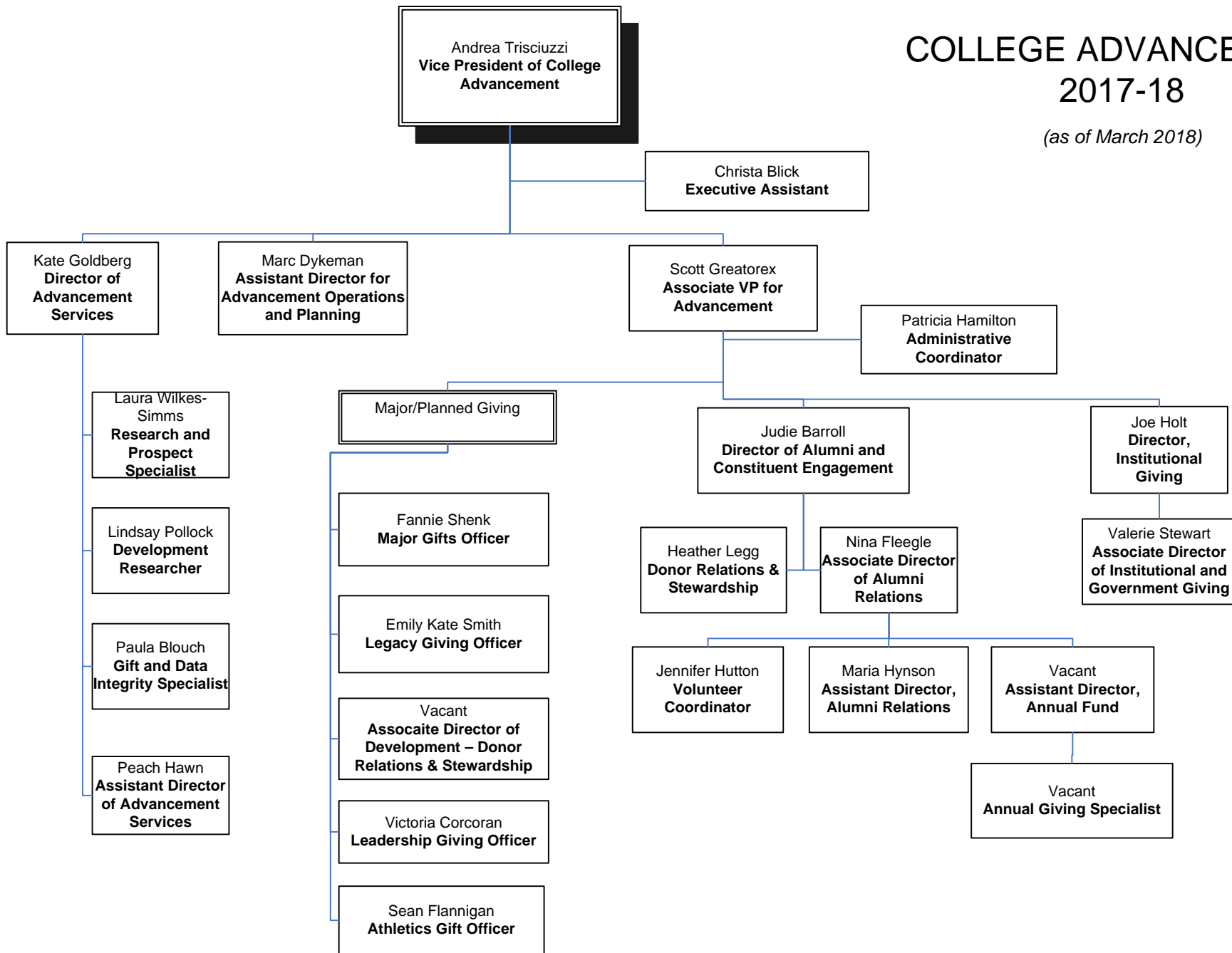


ENROLLMENT MANAGEMENT 2017-18
